

# Do I need a cover letter? What should I include in it?

The short answer is **YES**. The cover letter allows you to sell yourself on the particular position you are applying for. There are three things you should address in your cover letter.

**1) State why you are qualified for the position.** This one just makes sense. Review the qualifications in the description and address the top few qualifications with examples of how you meet those qualifications.

**2) What is it that you like about the company/position you are applying to?**

It's like dating. You have to tell them why you like them, or why are they going to like you back? Sure, you are qualified for the position, but so are the other applicants.

**3) What makes you stand out from the other candidates?** Highlight a few of your biggest accomplishments or best qualities to sell yourself as the *better* qualified candidate.
