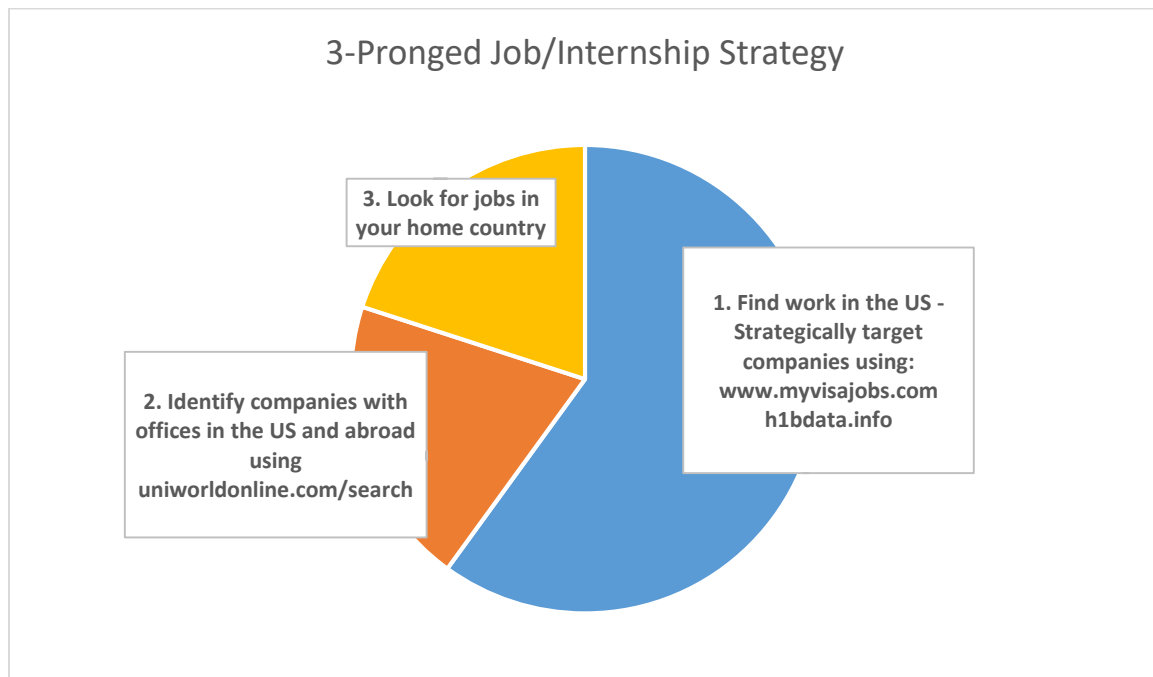

 - VERY important in the US! Networking is the practice of developing professional relationships, which ideally lead to jobs or internships. The more that you network, the more you gain exposure to potential opportunities. Networking also exposes you to American culture and helps build your confidence. Ask your career center for help if you don't know how to build your network.
 - Networking can be uncomfortable for anyone. Remember that networking is not about asking for a job. It's about having conversations with professionals in your chosen field and maintaining relationships with them.
 - Where can I network?** Student Organization Meetings, Campus Events and Presentations, Professional Association Conferences and Events (try volunteering at them to get in for free!), Networking Focused Events off-campus, Industry Trade Shows, Career Fairs, and LinkedIn.
