

## Applying and following up with your target employers

Wondering what to do with your list of 30-40 employers that you created after [last week's issue](#)?

Follow these steps to leverage that list efficiently:

1) [Log on to UICcareers.com](#) to find which companies post jobs targeted to UIC students, and apply to those that interest you and you're qualified for. UICcareers specializes in entry-level jobs and internships, so you don't have to comb through hundreds of jobs like you would on other job boards. All of your target companies will not be posting their openings on UICcareers, so be sure to check their website's career section periodically and [set up job alerts](#).

2) Then, to set yourself apart from other job seekers, [find recruiters](#) to follow up with on LinkedIn. Your short message should be a *mini* cover letter (2-3 sentences) highlighting which position

you're interested in *and why*. Thank them for reviewing your application. Following up increases the likelihood that your application will be reviewed.



3) Reach out [on LinkedIn](#) to UIC alumni who work at your target companies, or, if you can find their email addresses online through sites like [ZoomInfo](#) or [Hunter.io](#), email them. Remember that you're not asking them to help you find a job; you're asking them for a brief conversation to discuss their company and career path, otherwise known as an

[informational interview](#). You may not get a response from the first person you reach out to; if you haven't heard back within one week, move on to another contact. **NOTE:** You can (and should) conduct informational interviews with both engineers and non-engineering alumni! Remember, UIC alumni should be considered part of your network.

4) If there are no UIC alumni at some of your target companies, find people on LinkedIn who have similar interests as you, and mention that in your outreach.

5) Research company websites and social media to discover industry events in which representatives from your target companies are attending. You should attend those events and network. Have your [elevator pitch](#) ready!

Applying is only the first step. The more steps you take after the first one, the better your results will be.
